






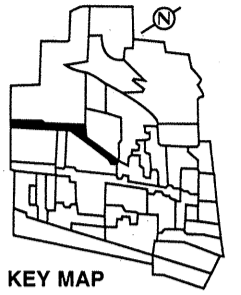


Character Area 15 Côte Road

A long and eventful history is ingrained in the rural atmosphere of this former Indian trail. It was one of Montreal's first inland "cotes" - the roads radiating from Ville-Marie onto which the long narrow strips of land (granted to farmers) fronted. The area includes several buildings of considerable historical as well as architectural importance dating from the early eighteenth to the early twentieth century. Among the most significant are the Hurtubise farmhouse (early eighteenth century), "Metcalfe Terrace" (1840) and "Riverview" (1847).
